Happy Heart Banquet

Each year, the school and church hold a banquet at which the students in the 3-8 grade class help serve and clean-up. This year's banquet will be Saturday evening, February 20, at 7 pm. The students should wear all black or as close to all black as they can. We hope your whole family can come and enjoy the tasty food and fellowship together. In lieu of an admission fee, we ask that each family bring some items for the dinner; these items are listed on the sign-up sheet.

Ready...Set...Mush! (on Monday)

Coming up beginning February 1: This reading program is inspired by "The Last Great Race" (a.k.a. the Iditarod) that takes place each March in Alaska.

The students will bring home an I-did-a-read Reading "Trail" Log on February 1. Students should keep track of their reading minutes in this Trail Log. Each minute read is equal to one mile in the race (or 2 miles for K-2). Each box is worth **10** minutes (**5** minutes for K-2nd graders). Your parent must initial each box to verify that you read for the designated time. Bring your Trail Log to your teacher each day and she will help you to move your sled dog along the trail! All reading for the I-did-a-read is reading aside from assigned school work. The "trail" is just under 1000 miles. If you read for about 45 minutes each day (20-25 minutes for K-2nd grades), you'll reach Nome in time. Everyone who reaches Nome by February 28 will be invited to participate in the IHAS Red Lantern Celebration which will be a skating party at West River Ice Center on March 2 (\$2/person).

Students will be given just one trail log, so keep track of it! Completed logs must be turned in on Monday, March 1 in order to enable you to be a part of the skating party. Students who are not part of the student body at

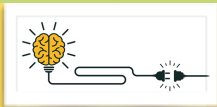

A language I wish I could speak is French.

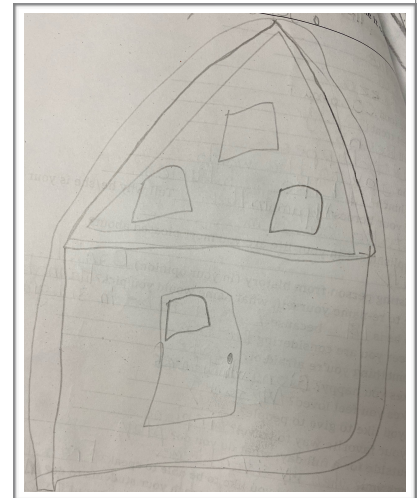
If I were a teacher, I'd teach my students how to do math.
