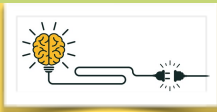

A thing that bugs me is if someone bites me.

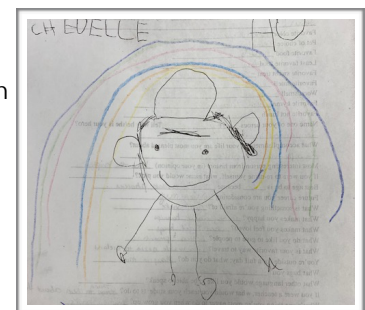
If I were a teacher, I'd teach my students about Jesus.
