Week of Prayer

We received a rich blessing this week when Pastor David Machado and musician, Benjamin Jenkins, came to share with us each morning. The theme was "Jesus and Me." Our theme song was "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus." The first morning, Pastor Machado told a story about a man who got an umbrella because he was told it would keep him dry. He was disappointed when he still got soaked in the rainstorm even though he was holding this wonder stick. He learned however, that in order to be effective, the umbrella had to be opened. Pastor Machado encouraged us to apply the same principle to our Bibles. We must open them and read them in order to be blessed by them. Tuesday, he reminded us that God is with us and watching over us wherever we go. On Wednesday, Pastor Machado talked to the students about *why* we should want to study the Bible: 1) Jesus is our Maker, 2) He sustains us each day, and 3) He died for us to save us from our sins. On Thursday, Pastor Machado concluded by talking about how the Word of God is the Bread of life. Just as we need to eat physical food daily, we also need to eat the Bread of life regularly by studying God's Word. And just as the Israelites said, "Manna" (*What is it?*) when they saw the bread God sent from heaven, we need to ask God daily, "What is it you have for me today from your Word?" Thank you, Pastor and Ben! We will miss you!!



If I were a dad, my top three rules would be:


1) no jumping 2) no screaming 3) no calling people on the phone when I'm not there unless it's important
