A Time for Giving

For the past three years we have picked a few special projects through ADRA (Adventist Development and Relief Agency), and this year we will do the same.

Project A: \$5/goat share or \$40/1 goat to provide a family with a goat

Project B: Chickens and eggs; \$5/chick

Project C: You can help by donating toward a new well being dug in a village. \$5/share or \$10,000/new well

Project D: Your gift turns plastic bottles (filled and encased in concrete) into homes for families with no other options. \$1/bottle or \$35/square foot of a new home

Project E: You can give them warm, delicious meals at school so they don't have to go hungry. \$5 to give a meal to 12 kids
