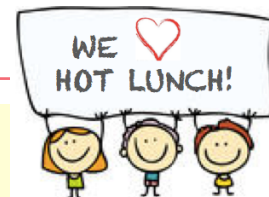

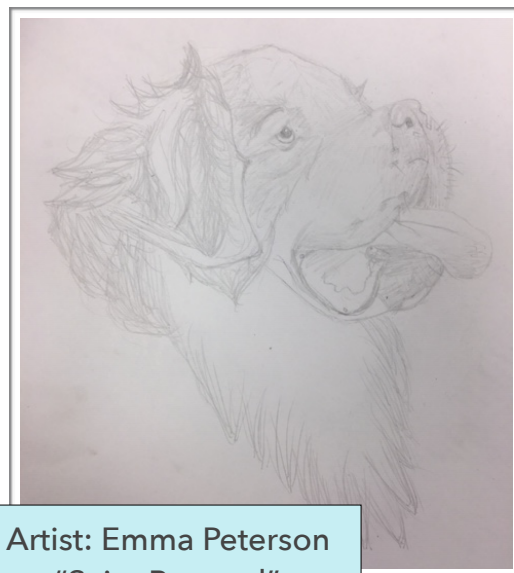

One thing I'm most eager to do as an adult is to organize my house and barn how I want.

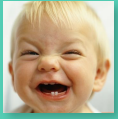
